Building capacity in C4SC & Media Rights

Young people have tremendous potential to bring about positive change in the country.

It is important to invest in young leaders and provide them an opportunity to understand the many facets of social development in India and the poverty of voice that many marginalized communities in the country continue to face.

It is also important for the next generation to be critical analysts and thinkers that look at ICTs and media through the lens of human rights and freedoms, so that they gain a nuanced understanding of how India is being shaped politically, socially and economically. To do this, they must learn to critically evaluate media (including new media and the internet); and explore the concepts of freedom of expression, the right to privacy, the ethics of media reportage, broadcast modern policies, communication-for-social-change (C4SC) theory and practice.

The Ideosync - UNESCO - India Fellow (IUIF) C4SC and Media Rights Fellowship program takes young Indians through an intense 15 month-long leadership journey that sets them on the path to understand Communication and Media from a rights perspective. The programme exposes Fellows to a variety of mentors and inputs from a wide of communication streams variety disciplines. IUIF Fellows learn to explore new pathways and media technologies for information creation, access, and sharing, thereby leading to better social, political and economic outcomes for the most marginalised communities of India by leveraging the power of communication.

The IUIF Programme is designed, managed and implemented by **Ideosync Media Combine**, an award-winning internationally recognized C4SC organization based in the NCR of Delhi, India.

IUIF: Vision

The IUIF Fellowship envisions a future where leaders in all spheres of life are driven by compassion, commitment and an understanding of the social challenges that India faces - in particular with respect to access to information and knowledge and equity in its creation; and where IUIF Fellows become thought-leaders and drive change by using communication in a creative and participatory way, to foster diversity of voices and opinions; expand freedom of expression; and ensure greater citizen access to, and rights over, media.

IUIF: Mission

Our mission is to engage young Indians in exploring ways to reduce inequities of power and knowledge through C4SC and media scholarship and action; and to provide young Indians an exposure to the complex web of social political and economic challenges that foster inequity. Through this Fellowship, we hope to help young people use communication tools and media to seek solutions to development challenges by building community capacities through participation in community media, and through the creation of shareable open knowledge repositories.

The IUIF Fellowship is a learning platform for young Indians to undertake a journey to discover their own leadership potential and commitment towards knowledge equity, freedom of speech and expression, independent media, media rights and C4SC.

The process includes training, mentorship, spaces for reflection and experiential learning, and hands-on work experience with C4SC, ICTs, community media, digital media and other similar areas of scholarship and practice.

IUIF Fellows are placed with leading organizations working on communication for social change and ICT for development across India.
